He was a fighter. Up to the end, he always had a good quality of life. I asked myself many times “How much can a person take?” Well, my Dad took a lot, and always bounced back with a positive attitude. A lot of my optimistic views come from the lessons that Dad taught.

I can remember so many of the great things that he did for my family. He was a loving father and faithful husband. We had a lot of good times with my Uncle Frank, Grandmom and Grandpop Krol, and Grandmom York. RIP Grandpop York as I really did not have a chance to know you but I am sure you had some great times with Dad too. I really had a lot of time this week to think and it was therapeutic looking at all the pictures. Dad worked so hard to provide for us and he was a good man. I can go on and on and on for hours.

I truly have so many good memories.

One that always comes to mind was when he worked the second shift. I had a Lego set, and I wanted him to build the boat that was on the box. I told him and one morning when I woke up, there it was.

I remember telling him that I always wanted to go to the monster truck show. Low and behold, he surprised me with tickets.

I remember all of the summers that we spent vacationing up the mountains staying at Indian Rocks on Lake Wallenpaupack. He would always take me to the amusement parks there to let me drive go carts, hit at the batting cages, play pinball and arcade games, and “of course” we would always play air hockey together.

Speaking of games, we used to bond as a family playing Pac Man on the original Atari 2600 which presented some really great times

on "C" Street.

Then there was the Boy Scouts. He was so involved and we had a lot of bonding time at camping trips, meetings, events, and who can forget the Klondike that our troop 316 at St. Ambrose always had to dominate. I guess that is where my competitive spirit and leadership skills come from. My Dad made a lot of lasting friendships through the Boy Scouts. You all know who you are and he is proud to now watch over you.

Around the time in the Boy Scouts, he had a green hornet (that was a car...AMC brand) that I believe he bought off my Uncle Frank. Later on that green hornet became a green hornet with a brown door. The point is that family always came first and possessions came last. He made do with what he had, and provided the best to us including 12 years of Catholic School to me.

I know he always wanted the best for me. While I wanted to be a rock star, he wanted me to be an engineer. I remember him taking me down to Drexel, but I was not interested at the time. I did become much more interested after he got me an internship at his company which I very much disliked (dirty smelly, etc.). For those of you who may not know, my Dad was a machinist and one that was dedicated. He worked at the same company for over 30 years and his job was not easy. I can attest to that.

One thing led to another, and I did start engineering school at Penn State. I remember telling Dad that I needed to get a computer. Once again, he started to do his research. At that time he was gracious enough to get me a Gateway 2000 P5-120MHz with 16 MB of Ram, a 500MB HD, and a 17" monitor that weighed 200 pounds. That computer was \$3000. I remember that he also took a liking to the computer. I remember him checking stocks through the 56k modem to AOL. He also used to play some games like Space Cadet Pinball.

We are all one family now.

It was his time, and my Mom and I are so happy that he went peacefully. He has truly been through so much and now he is in a better place. In fact, he is probably shaking his head right now because of all of the attention. He probably also wants a Pepsi.

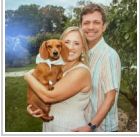
